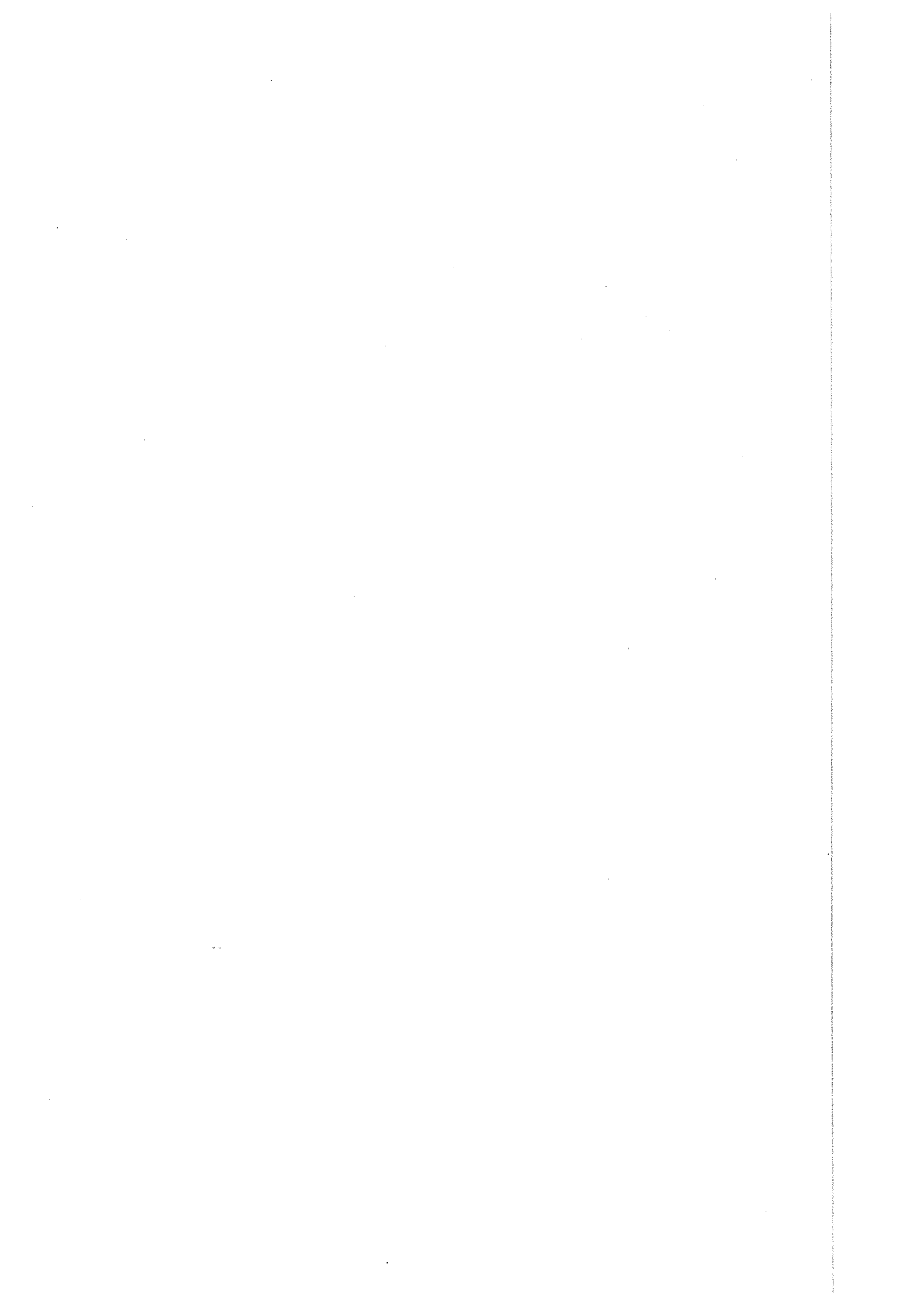

## INTRODUCTION

THE Council of the Folklore Society commissioned me to keep up my Bibliography of FOLKLORE (1961) for ten years, when they hoped to publish it. I have edited each of the 40 parts of the Journal as they have appeared since 1958, but unfortunately have not been able to see it through the press. I am therefore extremely gratified that Dr Percival has been able and willing to do this for me.

This volume is on the same pattern as the Bibliography of FOLKLORE (1961) of which it is a continuation; but it is more truly a Bibliography of FOLKLORE in that Reviews have been included in this work. They were previously omitted since their inclusion would have doubled the size and cost of the (first) volume.

As books for review are returned to the Library by their reviewers, this work, incidentally, also indicates the major part of the books which have been added to the Society's Library during the last decade.

In the Bibliography, the Reviews are listed under the author of the book, not under the reviewer, though both names appear in the Author Index.

There is an entry for each item published whether book, article, or letter. Obituaries (listed under the name of the deceased and not that of their writers) and important notices also appear, but other non-original material has usually been omitted. I have amplified each entry, where necessary, and detailed the scope or explained its meaning by additions in the text of the entry, which have been placed in square brackets [ ].

Since each article appears in only one place in the bibliography, I have had to choose between placing it under the folklore theme or with the locality in which the latter occurs and I have given preference to the former; e.g. "Witchcraft in Essex" appears in the bibliography under *Witchcraft*, not under *Essex*. Sections B (British Isles) and C (Foreign Countries) therefore cover only those articles which concern them in a general way or articles which for some particular reason appear to belong there rather than elsewhere. For particular aspects which concern localities the reader is referred to the two Topographical Indexes.

The Classification adopted is the same as before except that some subdivisions, e.g. those in 107 (individual animals) have been changed. No new divisions have been added except 45(a) Poland. Austria has been added to 38. Where no article has appeared on a Classification division during the period covered, this is indicated by a dash: —. Thus the Classification numbers remain the same as in the original volume.

Authors with hyphenated names appear under the first part of the name. A peer has been placed under his title rather than his surname. If a woman has written under her maiden name and also under her married name, her work is collected, usually under the former.

Towns and villages are indexed, usually, under the main part of their name e.g. Tew (Little). Countries appear rather than the people inhabiting them: e.g. Belgium (not Belgians); African (and other) tribes are under their names, not under the territory in which they live (e.g. Bakgatla not Botswana).

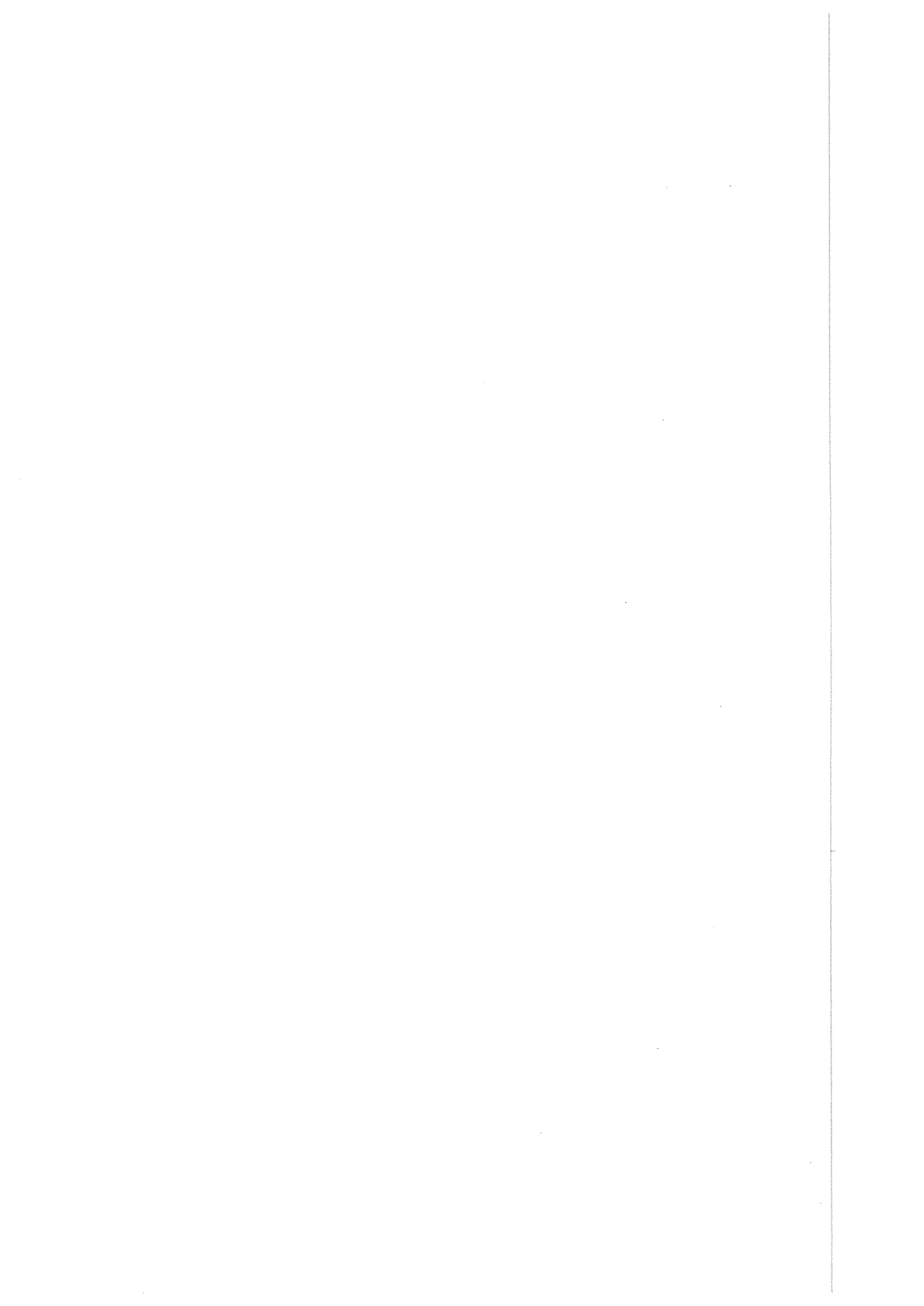
